For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith." —- Romans 1:17 (ESV)

Many believe the start of the Reformation began on October 31, 1517. The renown pastor and professor of New Testament Studies at Wittenberg Seminary marched up to the chapel door of the university. With hammer in hand, Rev. Dr. Martin Luther nailed a parchment with 95 theses inscribed upon it to the chapel door. The purpose was to stir an academic debate among his colleagues.

Luther's writing became public because of Johannes Gutenberg. In 1455, Johannes invents a press known as the Gutenberg press. The efficiency of this press enables pamphlets and books to be mass produced inexpensively and with great speed. Luther's 95 Theses was mass produced and spread throughout Germany and Europe like fire on dry grass. And so, the Reformation began.

Luther never intended for the church to become divided. His purpose was to bring the church back to God and God's Holy Word, the Bible. He was so impacted by Paul's writing lifting up God's generosity of graces. Romans 1:17 became the catalyst for Luther Biblical understanding of salvation. He shifted from the sense of "salvation comes from my deeds by keeping God's law" to "We are saved by God's gracious acts through the cross and resurrection of Christ Jesus." This German Augustinian monk sought to bring the church back to the revelation "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God (Ephesians 2:8)."

While at the Diet of Worms in Augsburg. Luther was challenged by Charles V and the Johann Eck, Pope Leo X's representative, to recant his writing. This sagely pastor could not turn his back from God or God's Word. Luther while

holding the Bible in his hand, declared, "I am bound by the Scriptures I have quoted and my conscience is bound to the Word of God... I cannot do otherwise, here I stand, may God help me. Amen."

Luther fastens himself to God, believing in Jesus, and faithfully placing his life into God's care! Like Luther, we too remain secured to God and His Word. We too stand for God and God's Word! Our time spent each week in the divine service, that is worship, opens our very soul, so that we can hear God's message given to us through the Liturgy (compilation of scripture verses), scripture readings, and the sermon. We gather in the sanctuary to be in the presence of God, and to be bless by his gracious gospel of salvation demonstrated by forgiving us in the sacrament of Holy Communion.

Our October worship services will focus on a sermon series entitled Faith and Family. Each week we will explore God's gift of marriage, Christian Parenting, Children Living in Faith, the Life of a Single Christian, and the Christian Family, AKA the Church. Here is our preaching schedule for October.

October 2 - Faith and Family: Marriage

October 9 - Faith and Family: Parenting

October 17 - Faith and Family: Children

October 23 - Faith and Family: Single Life

October 30 - Faith and Family: Christian Family of Faith



#### St. John Evangelical Lutheran Church Church Council Meeting Minutes for September 2022

The Church Council of St. John Evangelical Lutheran Church met for its monthly meeting on September 12, 2022, at 6:00 pm. Council Vice-President, Herbert Klatte Jr., called the meeting to order prior to the President's arrival. Pastor Norm Sulaica opened with scripture and prayer. All members except Jennifer Schroeder were present. The August minutes were approved as distributed.

#### **Unfinished Business**

- Motion to approve the Sexual Misconduct Policy drafted by Sharon Neutzler and Pastor Norm, to comply with insurance requirements by our insurance carrier, Heffernan Religious Institution Program and to appoint the Community Concerns Chairperson to oversee its implementation. 
