To the saints and faithful brothers and sister in Christ: May grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord. Amen.

"Merry Christmas" was a common greeting used when I was growing up in San Antonio. It was spoken this time of year at family gatherings, school, and especially at church. With joy-filled hearts, we greeted others with the intent of bring the Nativity joy to other's lives. Truly, we celebrated the birth of Jesus. We celebrated God's saving grace in action in our world then, and His saving action today.

Have you noticed that our world is changing? We went through a time where we shortened "Merry Christmas" to "Merry X-mas". Time passed and now people are saying "Happy Holidays". In fact, speaking the words, "Merry Christmas", is wrong today. It is considered offensive. It implies God who enters our world because He loves us. As a baby in the manger, our Savior engages our world for our sake. He addresses the constant barriers which shackle us – sin, evil, death, and Satan. He frees us from these dark chains. The world does not want to hear this special loving message that the babe in Bethlehem brings.

Personally, I do not want to suggest or imply God's message of grace to the people of Washington county. Following in the footsteps of Paul, Peter, James, and John, it is appropriate to be emphatic, open, and direct about the gospel. People in the Christmas Season are caught up in the images of what they believe Christmas should be like – perfect family gatherings, perfect parties, perfect meals, perfect gifts, etc... Do you know people today take back their Christmas gifts and trade it in for something else? It is a common practice in seeking a perfect Christmas. So, it is not a surprise to find depression, suicides, and family violence running wild this time of year.

Perfection and joy are not found in eggnog, wrapped presents, and parties. One finds joys in gospel story of God's love for us shown to us in the Bethlehem babe in the manger. This historical and divine message is our God comes to us as in innocent babe for the purpose of saving us! It is this message of peace and joy that brings comfort to so many people. So, join me this year in sharing the story of the baby Jesus and God's holy love with someone who are hurting, depressed, lost, and alone.

God blessing be with you, and Merry Christmas from Sulaica family.

Daily Devotions

Scripture gives us a deeper sense of our Heavenly Father. It offers a myriad of topics which are relevant and applicable to our daily life. Relationship with God, people, children, and spouse are only a few topics we discover through the passages of God's book.

People of God have importantly practiced daily prayer, scriptural reading, and meditation to shape their relationship with God. Here is a pattern Christians have used for over thousands years in their walk of faith.

Find a place such as a garden or a family den which offers quietness. Sit. Meditate. Create a box of nothingness, that is empty your heart, mind, and soul of everything. Freeing yourself of the world opens yourself up to the Lord. Understandably, we do come to this prayer moment with worldly issue from work to family. Should this take place, pray to God to receive these concerns. Then, prepare yourself, placing each of these concerns in God's care. Now, mediate and empty yourself. These silent moments in time will become longer and longer as peace settles upon you.

Now, read scripture. A list of readings is given for us below. Begin by reading these passages in silence. Pause and now read these Godly words aloud. Hear the message. The Bible was originally based down from generation to generation by word of mouth. It was meant to be heard.

The Church Council of St. John Evangelical Lutheran Church met for its monthly meeting on November 14, 2022, at 6:00 pm. Council President, Kenneth Seeker, called the meeting to order. Pastor Norm Sulaica opened with scripture and prayer. All members were present. The October minutes were approved as distributed.

Unfinished Business

Steve Skrla gave an update on the insurance claim for the lightning strike.

Council reviewed proposed update to Building Use and Wedding Policies. Comments will be incorporated in another draft for council's review next month.

New Business

For month of October, the total Weekly Giving Deposits were \$11,130 plus loose offering of \$605 and Direct Deposits were \$4,232.63 for a total giving of \$15,967.63. [The sum of \$23,150 monthly is needed to meet the 2023 budget approved at the October semi-annual congregational meeting.]

Community Concerns Report India Randermann

Food Pantry served 74 families (133 people) at two distributions in October. Approximately 67 persons were served at the funeral reception for Susan Kuhlmann. At the Blood Drive, 6 individuals donated whole blood and 4 individuals donated double red cells.

Worship and Music Report Mary Longhofer

The usher list for 2023 is being revamped to accommodate one worship service.

Parish Education Report Jennifer Schroeder

SS hosted a Halloween Celebration of hayride, trick or treating, and dinner on Sunday, October 30, with

over 92 participants. Christmas program practice has started. The following dates are on the SS calendar: Christmas tree set-up will be 10am on November 25 and take down will be 3pm on January 1. SS Christmas in the Country after worship service on December 18 to include hayride, face painting, arts/crafts, and hot dogs for lunch. There will be no children's SS on October 30, December 18, December 25, and January 1. Children's SS classes will resume January 8.

Family Fish Fest on October 22 brought in 297 lbs. of fish. The participants had a great time and ended the day with a fish fry.

Evangelism Report Josh Clay

Approximately 188 persons (10 shut-ins, 92 plates taken to go, and 86 dined in) were served at the Good Neighbor Sunday on November 13. Donations in the amount of \$1,240 were received to help offset the meal cost of \$2,204.02.




