Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want. ² He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters. ³ He restores my soul. He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake. – Psalm 23

Can we agree the world revolves around change? Our culture travels at lightspeed changing our beliefs, our morals, and our values. The use of respectful words to your neighbor is replaced with cursing or degrading people. No cash bail policies allow criminals to be released on the day of their arrest, which allows for more crimes to be committed. That is the job of the shepherd. What is the second verse in the twenty-third Psalm? " ² He makes me lie down in green pastures. He leads me beside still waters." Our Good Shepherd Jesus strengthens us with hope and freedom! Our troubles do not have to paralyze us. Our daily plights do not have to incapacitate us. We have hope through our Good Shepherd Jesus! Our difficulties do not have to petrify us. We do not face our daily woes alone. Jesus, our Good Shepherd, is with us to strengthen us, encourage us, guides us, and especially lead us to greener pastures and still waters. Jesus comes to show us a better, godly way!




