Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth. –John 1:14

Lloyd C. Douglas, author of The Robe and other novels lived in a boarding house when he was a student. On the first floor of the house there lived a retired music teacher who was confined to a wheelchair. Every morning as Douglas went down stairs he would stick his head in the music teacher's room and ask his friend; "What's the good news?" To which the music teacher would respond each day by striking a tuning fork against the side of his wheelchair and saying; "Middle C! Hear that, it's middle C! It was middle C yesterday, it's middle C today, and it will still be middle C 1,000 years from now. The tenor upstairs sings flat, the piano across the hall is out of tune, but my friend - that is middle C!"

For 2,000 years we have celebrated God love for us. This love takes form in a baby born in a backward southern small town know as Bethlehem. The disciple, John, writes Jesus "became flesh and dwelt among us." God love and care for us is so deep that He enters our world to bring us His saving grace. His life among us signals the beginning of the necessary steps needed to bring forgiveness, new life, and eternal life to all believers. Christmas is a time of joy. It is a time to celebrate that the most valuable and precious gift ever given to us -- the baby Jesus, who is our Savior!

God's love and care is our middle C. Just like middle C could be counted on by the music teacher to be middle C always and forever, so too can we count on God to love and care for us, to come as a baby in a manager, to see us as children worth adopting and saving, even dying for, to be the light that cannot be extinguished, no matter what.




